

## **N506 Media Arts and Technology Project**

(6 credits)

### **Student Goals and Objectives**

The Media Arts and Technology Project is a course taken during the final year giving the student an opportunity to synthesize knowledge and skills attained through course work in the field, by conducting an original project. A portfolio or interactive resume is not an acceptable project.

The Media Arts and Technology Project must be focused around a specific subject or content area. Students create and orally present a project combining multiple elements of digital media. Requirements include original work to be researched, developed and produced in the area of new media.

Final projects are to be submitted in digital format for permanent archive. Students are also required to submit a minimum of a ten page typed document describing the original research and developmental process of their project.

### **Project: Overview**

1. Schedule a time to meet with your instructor.
2. Select a capstone project to be negotiated with your instructor the semester before enrolling in N506.
3. A student who enrolls in this course must complete the following information and secure approval from his/her instructor prior to registration.

### **Procedure**

1. Make sure you are eligible to graduate. Please review your status with your instructor prior to submission of project application.
2. Discuss your project with your instructor at least 3 months prior to end of the semester **before** the semester in which the project is to begin. If all the above has been approved, please prepare the following information as detailed in application format section below.
3. Once the application has been approved and signed by the instructor, a copy of this document along with a completed Intent to Graduate form must be delivered to student services on the fifth floor of the IT building. Without completing this step the student will not be able to register for N506.

## **Application Format**

Application must be typed and submitted electronically as a word document or PDF file.

1. Title page
2. Your name
3. Course title and section, semester information
4. Body\*
  - a. Each page is to be single spaced with 1" margins
  - b. Normal text 12pt font size
  - c. Readable Font

The following questions are to be addressed in the body\*:

1. What are your personal and professional goals for this project?.
2. How will this project assist you in connecting theory to practice?
3. Detailed description of your project
4. Purpose of your project.
5. Who is the target audience of your project? Be specific
6. State your expected outcomes or deliverables of this project.
7. Outline expected timeline of your project. Set benchmark times that can be checked by instructor.
8. Projected resources and or sources of information you will need to successfully complete the project.
9. Strategies of assessment and/or usability studies. Detail how you plan on determining the success of the project.
10. What new information or skills do you think you will gain by doing this project?
